****To limit disease introduction into the Navajo Nation the following are the current requirements for livestock will be followed for entry & travel.**Unless otherwise stated requirements are for all four states****

Navajo Nation Animal Importation Requirements

HORSES

1. Horses must have an individual ID
2. Current health certificate & brand inspection
3. Coggins (EIA) test within the last 12 months (Date, Lab name with results of the test, lab accession number) on health certificate

CATTLE

1. Current health certificate, state entry permit (include age, originated from; one week prior to movement) with brand inspection
2. TB and Bangs test for UT, NM & CO, TB only for AZ
3. Trich test of breeding bulls CO, UT & AZ
4. Rodeo and roping cattle MUST have TB & RFID Tag

SHEEP/GOATS/LLAMAS

1. Scrapie ear tag or RFID in place
2. Current health certificate, state entry permit (out of state)
3. Statement on certificate by a veterinarian that states, "the sheep is/are not infected with bluetongue, nor exposed to scrapie or originate from a scrapie-infected or source flock"
4. Breeding Rams to be Brucella ovis – Negative (Tested prior to entry)
5. Llamas needs to be TB tested and have RFID on health certification
6. Dairy goats TB & Bangs negative

SWINE

1. Permanent ID, tattooed, ear tag or RFID
2. Health Certificate with state of entry permit number that states, "these animals have been not vaccinated for pseudorabies or fed garbage."
3. Pseudorabies test negative prior to shipping

NOTE: Due to the resent disease investigations in Arizona, New Mexico & Texas state regulations & Navajo Nation regulations are subject to change based on disease incidence. Plan appropriate when obtaining health certifications and required testing.
